As we make preparations to close the year, I reflect back on a multitude of new faces, new programs, and unprecedented growth. I cherish the friends and supporters we have amassed along the way, and look forward to welcoming more in the coming years. Our growth this year has been inspired by a need to change our standing as an animal shelter to a more dynamic "Humane Society"; a group of people who share the same passion, vision, and interests.



We started 2011 with great change. Fueled by suggestions from supporters just like you, we added new goals and objectives, polished our operating methods, and expanded many of our programs. In the following pages, you will read about how these changes are proving successful and defining the future of our area's animals. EMERGENCY MEDICAL FUND



One of the many great ways the HHS has improved the use of its funds is the re-design of the Emergency Medical Fund (EMF). The EMF is a financial assistance program designed to keep animals from being surrendered by their owners. Pet owners who are facing a medical emergency, but lack the means to pay for care, are eligible to receive assistance through the EMF. All applicants are reviewed on a case-by-case basis, and must provide proof of low income.

Using this fund, Halifax Humane Society has funded everything from eye surgeries to x-rays. We have also negotiated discounted rates with Atlantic Animal Hospital, allowing an increased number of animals that will be saved by the EMF. Halifax Humane Society has already helped more animals so far in 2011 than in the entirety of 2010, and is on pace to increase the total number of animals helped by the EMF by 34% for the year.

Buzz, a five-month old kitten, was probably bitten by a black widow spider. Due to the severity of the bite, he needed surgery to amputate one of his legs. His family did not have the money for the surgery, but did not want to give up on their beloved kitten. Buzz's winning personality won the hearts of the HHS and Atlantic Animal Hospital staffs, and it was decided that he was a great candidate for the EMF program. Buzz is now happily running around and shows no signs of missing his leg.

Peace, a Shar Pei catching some fresh air in her own backyard, was attacked by dogs that tore her fence apart. The mild-mannered Peace suffered gashes and wounds all over her body, and even on her head. Through the EMF program, Peace was sent to Atlantic Animal Hospital, which took good care of her. Eight months later, the outward wounds have healed, and Peace is showing great signs of recovery.

HUMANE EDUCATION

Respect for animals is the foundation of Humane Education. John F. Kennedy once said, "To educate our people, and especially our children, to humane attitudes and actions toward living things is to preserve and strengthen our national heritage, and the moral values we champion in the world." This holds true even today.

HHS Humane Education Manager Kate Thomas, along with her dog Murphy, is available for elementary, middle school, high school and college classes. These classes cover responsible pet care, dog bite safety, humane training, cruelty/pet overpopulation, and/or educational tours. Kate is also available for assistance with individual and group student projects.

Kindness is essential to good character and an important part of the way we treat others – both human and non-human. With the help of HHS supporters, humane education is alive and well in Volusia County.




FROM THE DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR

The goal of the development department is to build a strong relationship with our donors, while informing them of how we use the funds they give. By getting to know our donors, we found out just how passionate they are. They truly care about the challenges we are facing, and when a donor base cares about the cause, they push everyone to do better. This makes us more efficient fundraisers and better stewards of the gifts we receive. In the past two years, we have seen a great increase in the effectiveness of our efforts. The average non-profit sees 75% of its donations go to the programs and services it provides to the community. Anything above that is considered a success. In 2008, our efficiency fell and 70% of funds raised by the HHS went to the animals we care for. To our donors, that wasn't nearly good enough. A change was needed, and the HHS answered the call. The results have been immediate and impressive. In 2009, 81% of funds went directly to HHS programs and services, and in 2010, this number increased again to 83%. We expect to see this positive trend continue this year. At the HHS we have a saying, "Every penny we spend is like taking food right out of the bowl." It might be a bit dramatic, but it works. Halifax Humane Society is now designing fundraising programs that are

some of the most efficient in the country. This year, the cost for the development department to raise a dollar is just six cents. The national average is 20 cents. We are over three times more efficient than the rest of the country! The HHS is making changes our donors can be proud of. So when someone asks you why you give to the Halifax Humane Society, you can point to the numbers, or you can talk about all of the great services we provide for animals and animal lovers. Or you can simply say because they are changing for the better.

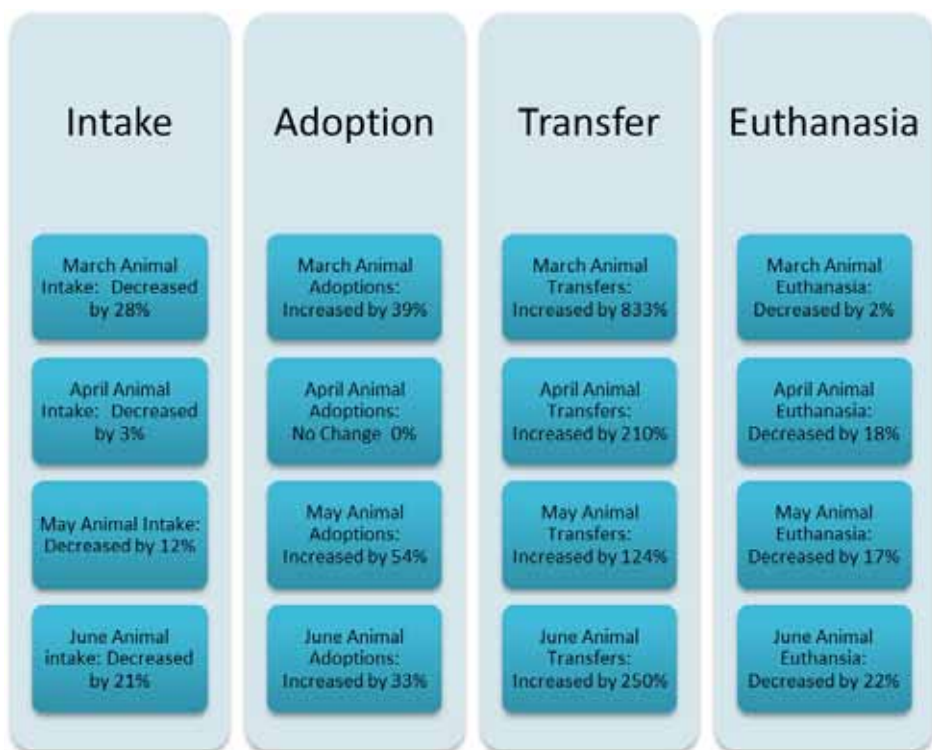


RIDES4RESCUES

Do you have a vehicle that you are looking to trade in or clear out of your driveway, but you are unsure of where to take it? You can put it toward a great cause by donating it to the Halifax Humane Society. You can do this through our special website, rides4rescues.org, which is a charity partner of the nation's leading vehicle donation program, Auto-Donation.com. Just about any vehicle, including boats, RVs, motorcycles, ATVs, and more can be donated.

The vehicle does not need to run, but it normally will require proof of ownership for donation. Once donated, most vehicles are sold at live auctions to ensure your contribution provides the greatest possible value to Halifax Humane Society. By supporting a 501(c)(3) organization like Halifax Humane Society, you may also receive a tax deduction. To learn more about donating a vehicle, check out rides4rescues.org.

WINDS OF CHANGE



HHS is also beginning to see a positive trend in its animal statistics. Staff and volunteers are doubling their efforts in many capacities to increase positive outcomes for animals through the many programs HHS offers. The results of a comparative analysis from 2010 to 2011 are tremendous. Since March of this year, animal intake and euthanasia percentages have been consistently decreasing, while adoption and transfers are steadily increasing, as shown in monthly comparisons. HHS looks forward to continuing this trend with the help of the community as we strive to continue and grow.

Halifax Humane Society has seen many changes over the years, but its primary goal has consistently been focused on improving animal care. The key to this success is to keep moving forward, and with that in mind, you will constantly see HHS in motion.

This year, HHS is experiencing an exciting turn that will drastically improve shelter operations and community outreach. In January 2011, HHS upgraded to PetPoint, a web-based animal shelter management program. PetPoint not only enables better tracking of the animals passing through HHS, but also allows the ability to run comparative analysis with other

animal shelters nationwide. Through this program, potential adopters are now able to search for their new pet and fill out their adoption application online without leaving their home. Another added benefit is the ability for HHS to provide the affordable 24PetWatch microchip and a 30-day gift of Pethealth's Shelter Care Insurance to all adopters. Each is an exceptional value to any pet owner, offering aid for lost pet recovery and access to the most widely used pet health insurance program within the shelter community.

By expanding its resources to provide better care and services to animals in need,



VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS 2.0

The Halifax Humane Society Volunteer Program is looking smarter than ever! HHS will soon be offering workshops and classes at progressive levels, providing volunteers with a more comprehensive understanding of the many positions that require their help.

The Level I curriculum will cover Basic Volunteering, which will be required for all volunteers. This course will provide volunteers with an overall knowledge of shelter policies and procedures, as well as necessary interpersonal and customer service skills. Level I Volunteering will also offer classes for animal handlers in Basic Dog Walk Training and Cat Socialization Training.

Level II classes will include Advanced Animal Handling for special events, offsite adoption, kennel assistance, and foster care, along with Advanced Administrative Aide workshops. Once volunteers reach Level III, they will be able to enroll in classes such as Meet Your Match Training, Adoption Counseling Training, and Pet Photography Training.

In addition to these exciting changes to the Adult Volunteer Program, HHS is pleased to introduce its Youth Volunteer Program. This program, along with the many shelter “paws- itions” it offers, has been specifically designed for youths age 14-17. Classes and training will be included in the Adult Volunteer workshops.

Finally, HHS is also organizing a Think Paws-itive Volunteer Youth Club for kids who would like to “unleash” their special skills, and turn ordinary volunteering into something truly extraordinary. Think Paws-itive Club projects are focused on several important areas, including Training and Education, Fundraising, and Community Outreach.

HHS SPECIAL EVENTS



The Halifax Humane Society's Special Events Department is experiencing a revitalization, as it strives to create events that are not only fun for everyone involved, but also generate a high return on the dollars spent on them. With that in mind, HHS created three signature events, which will take place annually and raise significant funds for the animals we serve. These signature events are the Mutt Strutt 5K Run, Island Party, and Fur Ball Gala & Silent Auction. If you attend one of these events, it is a promise that you will not leave disappointed.

In conjunction with the newly-created Halifax Paws Society, a group of young professionals dedicated to the HHS mission, there are now monthly "Yappy Hours" at local businesses in the community. Typically taking place at a restaurant or bar, these animal-friendly events charge \$5-\$15 for admission, and include appetizers and cocktails or drink discounts. FOSTER CARE PARENT



Can I crash at your place tonight?

Want a pet now, but can't make a 15-year commitment? Have time and space to help a homeless animal? Want to make a HUGE difference in the life of an animal? If you answered yes, then you could be a perfect foster care parent!

Foster care parents allow Halifax Humane Society to shelter more animals by vacating cages that would otherwise be occupied by underage or recovering animals. Foster families provide extra individualized care for the most needy shelter animals. Different pets have different needs, so you may choose what type of foster family you would like to be. You can instill confidence by giving extra TLC to a scared or unsocialized dog or cat, provide love and a safe place to grow

for puppies and kittens too young for adoption, run a rehab for a pet recovering from illness or injury, or be a campaign manager for an adoptable animal who just needs to be shown off.

You will watch amazing transformations as foster pets become healthy, confident, and ready for a forever home.

HHS collaborates with other organizations to create even more happy endings!

Ever ask yourself why more humane societies, shelters, and rescue groups don't work together? So do we! This year, Halifax Humane Society has transferred 356 animals to adoption partner organizations. HHS also provided relief to other shelters, and has evacuation

partners standing ready in the event of a disaster.

Transfer programs are fairly new to our area. They allow organizations to share resources and help find permanent homes for even more animals. Because intake demographics change from one shelter to another (weather, big cases, kitten seasons), the shelter partner program was created to share resources amidst emergent cases.
